The votes have been counted!

All of the applicants were worthy of consideration. We voted on 5 finalists and 3 were chosen for our grants.

Congratulations to the following nonprofits that have been awarded a grant from the Three Corners Women's Giving Circle for the 2015 calendar year.



Assistance League of Southern Utah (alofsu.org) \$5,000.

The Assistance League's signature program is Operation School Bell, which currently provides clothes, shoes, and literacy materials to about 500 financially disadvantaged elementary school children in the Washington County School District. Working with the schools, the Assistance League identifies children in need and provides them with the clothing and literacy tools that they need to be successful in school.

Our grant will enable the League to expand the program that they started with our grant last year to 50 middle and intermediate school girls (up from 30 last year). The girls will have the opportunity to "shop" for new school clothing in the Fall.

Dixie Care and Share (dixiecareandshare.org) \$3,000.

Dixie Care and Share offers “transitional” housing for men, women, and families, runs a food pantry, offers programs to assist residents to make positive decisions and improve their way of life, and helps residents find employment and permanent housing.

Our grant will enable 5 or more women below the poverty level to be given training and skills (e.g., phlebotomy, CNA) to improve their income via scholarships (max \$600 each) to various training facilities in Washington County. This is a brand new program made possible by our grant.

Doctors’ Volunteer Clinic (doctorsvolunteerclinic.org) \$6,000.

The Doctors’ Volunteer Clinic provides affordable healthcare to those who are caught “in the middle”. Their purpose is to bridge that gap by providing medical care, mental health services and dental care to those in the St. George community who would not otherwise be able to obtain services.

Our grant will be used to provide mental and medical health services to women and girls living 150% below the poverty level, with no health insurance, Medicare, or Medicaid, who have experienced abusive situations. Part of the grant is to purchase the ACT (Acceptance and Commitment Therapy) treatment plan (workbooks and other educational materials) and software to evaluate the program. Another part of the grant is to pay to have tests read that are performed at the Clinic (i.e., the Clinic can do a test like a pap smear, but currently the patient has to pay to have the test read outside the Clinic).
